As part of the SPHE programme in Junior Cycle (1st –3rd Years) SPHE teachers will be delivering lessons linked to Relationships and Sexuality. This delivery will take place between **January and April 2026**.

RSE is a required part of the curriculum and provides our students with a healthy understanding of all aspects of relationships. It will help them to develop positive attitudes and values towards their sexuality in a moral, spiritual and social framework. It will also help them develop skills for coping with peer pressure, conflict and threats to personal safety.

RSE provides opportunities for young people to learn about both relationships and sexuality, to increase their knowledge and skills, and to explore their attitudes in a safe environment.
