R.S.E. is a required part of the curriculum and provides our students with a healthy understanding of all aspects of relationships. It will help them develop positive attitudes and values towards their sexuality within a moral, spiritual and social framework. It will also help them develop skills for coping with peer pressure, conflict, and threats to personal safety.

We are aware that we are building on the conversations you have had with your son/daughter. We encourage you to continue talking to your son/daughter about the R.S.E. programme in school and to address any concerns he/she might have.

RSE is an **obligatory requirement** of the Department of Education and Skills and it should be inclusive. However, a parent's/guardian's right to withdraw a student from themes pertaining to sensitive issues will be respected on the understanding that the parent/guardian is taking full responsibility for this aspect of education. Parents are obliged to inform the school **in writing** of their decision to withdraw the child from RSE classes.
